

PACK 460 MALL EXPO BOOTH CONSTRUCTION

Pack 460 has selected world travel as the concept for our 2012 booth and the slogan on our display is:

SCOUTING IS A FUN, EXCITING, WORLDWIDE ADVENTURE

For Pack 460 this year, each den will be responsible to build a part of the booth as detailed below:

Tigers and Wolves will design and collect decorations for the 6' banquet table at the direction of Jonathan Day. Be creative. Suggested approach:

- Build a tablecloth and decorations according to the above theme. Perhaps think about things such as flags, globes, planes, etc. You may purchase a tablecloth if necessary.
- Perhaps have handouts such as stickers or temporary tattoos with the theme, or you may choose to plan a craft for visitors to build.
- Jason Bewley will have a fleur de lis stamp for kids to use, like last year if you want it.
- For the front of the table, we should probably have a sign that says, in some way, that scouts can bring and play their Bey Blades in our arena, or they can borrow our Bey Blades. See below for the arena that the Webelos are building.

Bears will build the 4' x 8' display backdrop at the direction of Jason Bewley. Suggested approach:

- Scouts brainstorm to create the slogan (done)
- Use 4'x8' plywood covered with construction paper
- Craft the message and all other required information such as chartered partner, etc.
- Have scouts supply cutout pictures with the above themes and paste on the board

Webelo's I and II will build a Bey Blades arena at the direction of Steve Hermansky. Suggested approach:

- Scouts design, select the materials and construct the arena. Be creative.
- Make sure the arena is very durable, since scouts will use it throughout the week. Perhaps consider a 2x4 frame with a plywood base.
- Make sure the arena is big enough for many scouts to view and play simultaneously. 30" x 30" is probably the biggest arena that we can fit comfortably in our booth. Perhaps section it off so multiple battles can be played simultaneously.
- The arena should probably be raised, like on a table, so kids aren't playing on the floor.
- Check the arena to make sure it has no sharp edges or other unsafe characteristics.
- Add details to the arena such as paint and obstacles that are consistent with the Pack theme.
- Upon completion, the scouts and leaders must check to make sure it is safe and durable.
